# Prayer Folder Assembly and Use Instructions

## Assembly

Materials needed: card stock, two letter size file folders, scissors, glue stick, hole punch (optional), binder ring (optional), lamination (optional), sandwich baggie (to hold cut pieces)

1. Print all pages. Pages one, two, seven and eight are best printed on card stock for durability.
2. Cut out the colored words from pages 1-2 on the gray lines. These are your “puzzle pieces.” Store in sandwich baggie.
3. Trim and mount pages 3-6 into two file folders using a glue stick.
4. Cut apart pages 7-8 on the colored lines. These can be laminated, hole-punched, and stored on a binder ring. Use these cards to review the prayer one line at a time.

## To Use

Place the puzzle pieces on the table next to the folder. For younger students you can leave the pieces very close to the proper order. Older students might like the challenge of mixing up the pieces. The important thing is not to frustrate the student.

Start by having your student place the puzzle pieces on top of the gray words on pages 3-4. They should recite the words out loud as they place the pieces.

Once the student is beginning to learn the prayer, have them move to placing the pieces into the boxes on pages 5-6. This provides a bigger challenge, but the size of the boxes helps to provide a check for the student. Once again, they should recite the prayer as they place the pieces.

Finally the student can assemble the prayer in order on a blank table top as they recite it. A second copy of pages 1-2 can serve as a self-check.
